

2025 Service-Learning Volunteer Position

Two openings for service-learning opportunities will be available during the 2025 summer break. No experience is needed, and training is provided for those with an interest in exploring the natural resources profession.

These unpaid positions provide a variety of hands-on field experiences and develop skills in areas such as invasive plant management, native plants, and green infrastructure maintenance. *If comfortable with herbicide application, students are able to become an Ohio Trained Serviceperson in herbicide utilization.*

Volunteers will report to the West Creek Management Center located at 1969 West Ridgewood Drive, Parma. The center is 0.3 miles from an RTA bus stop on Routes 53-53A.

Requirements

- A minimum 200-hour commitment including 6+ hour blocks of time at least three times a week (priority will be given to applicants committing greater amounts of time)
- Interest in and enthusiasm for learning about a natural resources career
- Positive disposition and strong work ethic
- Willingness to work in adverse weather conditions including rain, high or low temperatures, high humidity, insects, and difficult terrain
- Ability to walk up to 2 miles daily in challenging terrain
- Ability to carry a 30-pound pack for 4 hours a day
- Willingness to learn a variety of land management techniques including how to operate the relevant tools and equipment
- Willingness to carry out responsibilities in a safe and efficient manner
- Compliance with Cleveland Metroparks policies including a tobacco-free workplace
- Equipment provided by volunteer: a durable water bottle, sturdy outdoor footwear and pants
- Must be 18 years of age or older
- Driver's license **not** required
