HOW TO APPLY

APPLICATION INFORMATION

Requirements include:

- Successful completion of a Master's degree in counseling or clinical psychology or closely related field
- Research experience
- Experience in applied setting
- Strong academic records (undergraduate GPA of 2.85; graduate GPA of 3.5)

Good communication skills

- Strong letters of recommendation
- (including letters from graduate faculty)

Finalists in the selection process

- will be asked to participate in an on-campus interview
- Deadline: January 15



REQUIRED APPLICATION MATERIALS

- Graduate application
- Curriculum Vitae or resume
- Statement of purpose (see below or more information)
- Official copies of all undergraduate and graduate academic transcripts
- Three letters of recommendation (at least one must be from a graduate faculty member)

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

Personal statement should not exceed three pages, single spaced. Include the following information:

- What attracted you to the field of Counseling Psychology and the program at CSU
- Your experiences in applied settings
- Your research experiences (e.g. professional presentations, publications, or master's thesis)
- Your goals for graduate study and your professional career
- Your interests in research and practice, particularly as it is related to diverse urban populations
- Personal traits that ensure success in quantitative statistics


KELLY YU-HSIN LIAO. PH.D.
