I. INTRODUCTION

The Graduate Certificate in Twice-Exceptional Education consists of five courses, three of which are determined by the background of the applicant, for a minimum of 13 graduate credits beyond courses previously taken for licensure purposes. Because Twice-Exceptional education is the integration of special education and gifted education, this certificate provides a foundation in both fields, followed by teaching implications for teachers when exceptional areas of strengths and challenges are integrated in a singular child. The Certificate in Twice-Exceptionality will designate that a teacher has expertise in integrating gifted education and special education strategies to support the instructional and social-emotional needs of twiceexceptional students.

Note: New students should apply through Graduate Admissions for Graduate Certificate status in the Autism program. Applicants must be previously-licensed teachers in any field, including elementary, secondary content areas, special education, or gifted education. Currently enrolled graduate students should make an appointment to meet with an academic advisor in the ESSC, JH 170, to complete an intake prior to enrolling in these courses.
