

# NONPROFIT ADMINISTRATION + LEADERSHIP at Levin.

The Master of Nonprofit Administration and Leadership is a two year degree designed to prepare students with practical, hands-on knowledge and experience.

**The MNAL program focuses on management functions including fundraising, financial management, human resource management, philanthropy, proposal writing, program development, program evaluation, and applied management.**

At the Levin College of Urban Affairs you will receive a credential dedicated exclusively to the nonprofit sector with opportunities to participate in applied research, internships, and scholarly research within the field of nonprofit management. We offer evening classes, scholarship opportunities, and outstanding faculty.

Students complete 39 credit hours comprised of core courses, electives, and a capstone.

Our graduates work in nonprofit organizations across the nation, following our emphasis to create thoughtful practitioners in positions of management and leadership in the nonprofit sector.

## GRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIPS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Graduate Assistantships and scholarships are competitive, and are awarded to qualified students who have been admitted to Urban Affairs graduate degree programs. Candidates must have an undergraduate or graduate GPA of 3.0 or higher to qualify for and retain a graduate assistantship.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants to the Master of Nonprofit Administration and Leadership program must meet the minimum requirements established by the College of Graduate Studies and the MNAL program faculty:

- + A minimum undergraduate grade-point average of 3.0.
- + Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores, with an average Verbal and Quantitative score at the 40th percentile, and an Analytical Writing score of at least 4.0. Students with a graduate degree from an accredited U.S. college or university are exempted from this requirement. Other standardized admission examinations may be substituted at the discretion of the Program Director.
- + Two letters of recommendation, preferably from faculty.
- + Non-native English speakers must demonstrate English-language proficiency.
