Postbaccalaureate Teacher Preparation Program. The College of Education and Human Services offers a variety of teacher preparation programs for college graduates who have had little or no professional training in education. While these programs lead to licensure, most of the coursework they require cannot be applied to a graduate degree. All postbaccalaureate students seeking teacher licensure must fully meet the college's admission requirements and professional standards. Moreover, students must be available for fieldwork in area schools during the day and are urged to carefully plan their program of study since they must apply for practicum and student teaching placements two (2) semesters in advance of registration for these experiences.
